

Applications are invited for 20 seats of 3 year course in "General Nursing and Midwifery" for the session 2017-18. Candidate should have passed 10+2 or other qualifying examination from CBSE or other recognized Board. Both Male and Female candidates can apply. 85% seats are reserved for students who have passed qualifying examination from UT Chandigarh and 15% are reserved for General Pool for students who have passed qualifying examination from institutions located outside UT Chandigarh.

Prospectus and admission forms can be downloaded from web sites www.gmch.gov.in from 20/7/2017 to 10/8/2017. The duly filled application form along with payment of Rs.300/- for General Category and Rs.150/- for Reserved category by bank draft in favour of "Director Principal, Govt. Medical College & Hospital, Sector-32, Chandigarh" all working days from 9:30 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. (Mon to Fri) in the Admn. office of School of Nursing, Govt. Multi-Specialty Hospital Sector-16, Chandigarh.

INTRODUCTION

The School of Nursing was established in early 60's in General Hospital, Sector-16, Chandigarh with the aim to prepare midwives by providing six months diploma to the candidates who are already having General Nursing Training of three years. In 2001 diploma in General Nursing & Midwifery was started with funding from Ministry of Health and Family Welfare , Govt. of India for five years and after five years Chandigarh Administration took over .

OBJECTIVES

The nurses completing the course will be able to -

1. Demonstrate awareness of, and skills required in the Nursing process in the provision of health care and nursing of patients.
 - (a) They will be competent to :-
 - Assess the nursing needs of individual, families and communities throughout life from birth and death;
 - Plan appropriate action to meet their needs through competent safe nursing care;
 - Take appropriate action to help people retain or sustain their best possible level of health in all aspects;
 - Work with other members of the health team and community in promotion of health, prevention of illness, restoration of health and rehabilitation.
2. Apply relevant knowledge from the humanities, biological and behavioral sciences in carrying out health care and nursing activities and function.
3. Showing sensitivity and skill in human relationship and communication in her daily work.
4. Demonstrate skill in the use of problem solving methods in nursing practices.
5. Gain knowledge of health resources in the community and the country.
6. Demonstrate leadership skills in working with the health team, community and others in the provision of health care.
7. Demonstrate understanding of, and commitment professional behavior.
8. Demonstrate awareness of the necessity of belonging to profession and professional life.
9. Demonstrate awareness of the necessity of belonging to profession and professional life.
10. Promotion of health, precautions against illness, restoration of health and rehabilitation.

1. Information:-

Total Seats=20

UT Pool - 85%:- Chandigarh Administration circular No.19/1/93/IH(3-99/11136) dated 9th June, 1990 provides that 85% seats of the total sanctioned intake of an institution will be filled up from amongst the students who pass their qualifying examination from Schools/colleges recognized by the Chandigarh Administration and located in the Union Territory, Chandigarh as regular students of the said School/ College.

General Pool - 15%:- Remaining 15% seats will be filled from amongst students, who passed their qualifying examination from institutions other than those located in the Union Territory, Chandigarh or otherwise.

1. **Eligibility for Admission :-** Minimum and Maximum age for admission will be 17 and 35 years. There is no age bar for ANM/LHV.

2. **Minimum educational Qualification :-** Candidates should have passed one of the below mentioned qualifying examinations with aggregate marks of 40% for General Category, Dependents of Defence/Para- military Personnel and 35% for SC candidates.

i) 10+2 class passed preferably Science (PCB) & English with aggregate of 40% marks.

Or

ii) 10+2 in Arts (Mathematics, Biotechnology, Economics, Political Science, History, Geography, Business Studies, Accountancy, Home Science, Sociology, Psychology, Philosophy) and English Core/English Elective or Health care Science - Vocational stream ONLY, passing out from recognized Board under AISSCE/CBSE/ICSE/SSCE/HSCE or other equivalent Board with 40% marks.

Or

iii) 10+2 vocational ANM under CBSE Board or other equivalent board from the school and recognized by Indian Nursing Council with 40% marks.

Or

iv) Registered as ANM with State Nursing Registration Council.

Or

- v) Students qualified in 10+2 Arts or Science examination or Health care Science - Vocational stream ONLY conducted by National Institute of Open School with 40% marks.

3 Candidates should have passed Hindi/ Punjabi up to Matric Standard.

4 Student shall be medically fit.

5 Student shall be admitted once in a year.

6. **Eligibility for all categories of UT Pool seats:-** Candidates should have passed 10+2 or other qualifying examination from School / Colleges recognized by the Chandigarh Administration and located within the territory of Union Territory, Chandigarh only.

I). **Eligibility for Dependents of Defence/ Para – military Personnel seats:-** Five Percent Seats reserved for this category will be filled from the following categories of students ,in order of preference. (Please attach relevant proof).

- i) Sons/daughters / spouses of defense personnel who are awardees of gallantry decorations of Paramvir/ Mahavir/ Vir Chakra in person or posthumously.
- ii) Sons/daughters / spouses of defense personnel and para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. Who died while in –service and were wholly dependent on them.
- iii) Sons/daughters / spouses of defense personnel and Para – military personnel like CRPF-BSF etc. incapacitated while in –service and are wholly dependent on them.
- iv) Sons/daughters / spouses of ex-servicemen (defense and para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. and are wholly dependent on them.
- v) Sons/daughters / spouses of serving defense and para –military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. and are wholly dependent on them.

II). **Eligibility for Children/Grand Children of Freedom Fighters Category:-** The following are eligible (Please attach relevant proof).

Two percent seats in UT pool would be filled from amongst the children and grandchildren of Freedom Fighters. The wards of freedom fighter who have been sanctioned pension awarded 'Tamra Patra' by the Government of India would be eligible for reservation under this category. In the case of such freedom fighter, it would be a necessary condition for them to obtain certificate from the Deputy Commissioner of the concerned district. Grand children means son's sons/daughters or daughter's sons/daughters.

****Note: - Reservation in U.T. Pool: -** Two percent seats in UT pool would be filled from amongst the children and grandchildren of Freedom Fighters and two percent from Sportsmen/Sportswomen. One percent seats would be filled from physically handicapped candidates. The seats reserved for children and grandchildren of Freedom Fighters and Sports person would be filled on every alternative years for four years and on every 5th year the seat would be offered to physically handicapped candidates.

***Reservation in General Pool :-** 15% of the seats of General pool are reserved for Scheduled Castes and 5% for Scheduled Tribes. The Scheduled Castes seats from the General Pool would be filled on every alternative years. The seats reserved for Scheduled Tribes would be filled after every 6 years.

PROCEDURE OF APPLYING

1. Before applying candidates are advised to go through the admission notice and the instructions carefully, published in the newspaper and then fill in the application form given in the prospectus.
2. Application for admission to the course is required to be submitted on the prescribed form enclosed with the prospectus along with prescribed fee of Rs.300/- for General Category and Rs.150/- for (S.C.) reserved category in the form of demand draft in the name of **Director Principal, Govt. Medical College & Hospital , Sector -32, Chandigarh.**
3. Category of reservation should be clearly written on the top of the application in prescribed column without cutting/overlapping.
4. No further change of category of reservation will be allowed.
5. Application complete in all respects must be accompanied with **self-attested photocopies of all relevant documents.**
 - i) Date of birth certificate.
 - ii) 10th passing certificate
 - iii) Passing certificate of 10+2 or other qualifying examination
 - iv) Detail marks sheet of 10+2 or other qualifying examination
 - v) Reserved category certificate i.e. Scheduled Caste, Dependents of Defense/Para-military Personnel, Freedom Fighters certificate issued by the competent authority.
6. Attach two self- addressed envelopes 23X10 cm bearing postal stamp of Rs. 5 each with application form.

The completed Application form in a sealed envelope , with top of the envelope clearly labeled **“APPLICATION FOR GNM COURSE”** Should reach in the office of **Principal, School of Nursing, Govt. Multi-Specialty Hospital, Sector -16, Chandigarh personally 10/8/2017 up to 1:00PM.**

Important Note:-

- i) The application received after the closing date will not be accepted. The institute takes no responsibility for any delay in the receipt or loss of application.
- ii) Incomplete application in any respect will be rejected.

CRITERIA FOR SELECTION:

1. All eligible UT Pool candidates will be considered for admission against General category seats in UT Pool according to their merit in the combined list in addition to the category /categories they have applied for.
2. **Selection Procedure:-** Only limited number of candidates will be called for counseling. Admission shall be made on the basis of merit (marks secured by the candidate in 10+2 examination). To start with the candidates having Physics, Chemistry and Biology will be considered for admission if the seats remain vacant, candidates having Physics and Chemistry and ANM/LHV/ Health Care Science (vocational stream only) will be considered. Candidates with humanities/Arts subjects will be considered for admission last of all.
3. **Inter –se- merit:-** If two or more candidates obtain equal marks in the 10+2 examination then the inter se-merit for admission to the course shall be determined on the basis of the following:-
 - (a) Candidate with higher marks in science subjects with biology will be higher in rank.
 - (b) Candidate possessing lesser attempts for passing 10+2 examination would be higher in ranking/merit list.
 - (c) If the marks obtained and attempts made in passing 10+2 examination or other qualifying examination are also the same then a candidate senior in age shall rank senior to the candidate who is junior in age.
 - (d) If the marks obtained, attempts made and age is same then candidate possessing more marks in aggregate will be considered higher in rank/merit list.

4. COUNSELING

Candidates according to the merit in 10+2 or other qualifying examination in each category will be called for counseling and the number of candidates called for counseling will be three times of seats in each category.

ADMISSION

List of selected candidates/waiting on the next day of counseling would be displayed board of School of Nursing, Government Multi-Specialty Hospital, Sector-16, Chandigarh. The same will also be displayed at the website of GMCH, Sector 32, Chandigarh.

5. JOINING:

Selected candidates must deposit their fee on the same day of counseling. The selection of those candidates who fail to deposit the fee on the same day shall automatically stand cancelled and next candidate from waiting list will be offered the seat. The waiting list will remain valid only till 30 September 2017.

In case any candidate remains continuously absent without valid permission for three days from competent authority in the first month of admission i.e. September her/his seat shall be automatically stand cancelled.

6. WAITING LIST:

The candidates on the waiting list will confirm the availability of seat from the office of Principal, School of Nursing, Government Multi-Specialty Hospital, Sector-16, Chandigarh.

7. MEDICAL EXAMINATION:

The board, constituted by the authorities, will do Medical Examination. Joining will only be accepted after the medical fitness.

- i) The annual fee can be deposited, in cash or demand draft in favour of **Director Principal, Govt. College & Hospital, Sector -32, Chandigarh** payable at Chandigarh and also through debit card/ credit card at POS machine at Academic Branch, GMCH-32, Chandigarh.
- ii) The Hostel Security 5000/- & Hostel Fee including Room Rent, Water & Electricity charges of Rs. 4800/- will be deposited through demand draft in favour of **Principal Medical Officer, GMSH-16, Chandigarh** payable at Chandigarh.

Examination guidelines

1. Shall have one regular examination followed by supplementary examination in a year.
2. The candidates if fail in more than two subjects in any nursing programme they can be promoted to next year
3. A candidate can take any number of attempts with a condition that maximum period allowed is 6 years. However all papers need to be cleared before appearing in the final examination
4. No institution shall submit student average internal marks more than 75% i.e., if 40 students are admitted in a course than the average score of the 40 students shall not exceed 75%.

Example of 5 students: A=25, B=20, C=22, D=21, E=24
Average score=89.6%

This will not be accepted by the SNRC

Eligibility for Admission to Examination

A candidate shall be eligible for the admission to the state Council / Board examination if the Principle of the school certificate that:

- (a) She / he has completed not less than eleven months of the course
- (b) A candidate must have minimum of 80% attendance (irrespective of the kind of absence) in theory and practical in each subject for appearing for examination. The diploma shall not be awarded to the student till she / he has completed the clinical / field requirements.
- (c) A Candidate must secure 50% marks in internal assessment separately in each theory and practical.
- (d) The record of practical experience is complete.

(The Principal shall send to the Council / board the internal assessment for each subject, i.e. both theory and practical (S) before the start of the examination along with the examination form).

D. GRADING OF EXAMINATION

Examination shall be graded on aggregate marks of the entire three and half years of the training programme, as follows:

Distinction	-	80% and above
First Division	-	70% to 79%
Second Division	-	60% to 69%
Pass	-	50% to 59%

E. THEORY EXAMINATION

1. Nursing teacher with minimum five years of teaching experience (recent) in a particular subject may be appointed as paper setters and examiners for that particular subject only.
2. Question paper should have a combination of essay, short answer and objective type question (Situation based Questions)
3. All units of a subject and sub-subject should be given due weightage in accordance with the instructional hours prescribed.

F. PRACTICAL EXAMINATION

1. Practical examination is to be conducted in the respective clinical area.
2. Nursing teacher with minimum of five years of teaching/clinical teaching experience in a particular subject/clinical area may be appointed as practical examiner.

OTHER INFORMATION :

- 1. Library :**
 - There is a well-equipped library with all essential professional reference and magazine etc.
 - Rupees 500/- will be charged as refundable security.
- 2. Hostel :**
 - Hostel is compulsory for every student. Hostel facilities are available for the students in Nursing Hostel. The students will be permitted one night stay and one day outing on Saturday/Sunday with the permission of Principal in a month provided their parents pick and drop the wards. All students are expected to abide by the rules and regulations of hostel failing which disciplinary action will be initiated.
 - The accommodation will be provided in the Hostel and the student is liable to pay room rent/electricity/water charges as applicable from time to time.
 - Room Rent : Rs.300/- p.m. Electricity and water charges of Rs.100/- per month will be deposited in advance of Rs.4800/- for whole year at the time of admission.
- 3. Mess :**
 - The students will make their own arrangement regarding mess, as the mess for students nurse is a co-operative mess in the nurses hostel.
- 4. Students Health**
 - The services of General Hospital are available to the student during the time of illness.
- 5. Counseling and Guidance**
 - Students personal problems will be looked into and necessary counseling and guidance will be given by the teachers. The students are free to approach faculty member for the purpose.
- 6. Sports and Recreation**
 - Picnic, parties and variety entertainment programmes are organized by the student Nurses Association of the School and Annual Sports Day organized by the School of Nursing will provide ample opportunities to the students to exhibit their personal talents.
- 7. Prevention of Ragging**
 - The Institute considers ragging as a cognizable offence. Stern action against the offenders shall be taken. Anyone involved in ragging will be punished in accordance with law, including expulsion from the institute and /or imprisonment up to 3 & ½ year and or fine up to Rs.25000/-

Rules and Regulations to be followed in the School of Nursing and Hostel

1. Relatives and parents are not allowed inside the hostel else fine up to Rs.500/- can be imposed.
2. No electrical appliances viz iron heater etc. are not allowed in the hostel.
3. Students are not allowed to leave the hostel without the prior permission of the Principal or Hostel Warden.
4. Only one night pass will be given in a month.
5. Entry in the Out Pass register is mandatory while going for night pass and outing.
6. Attendance is compulsory and should be marked between 7:00 pm to 8:00 pm.
7. TV room timing is up to 10 pm
8. Students are not allowed to enter the hostel during Clinical and college hours except during Tea Break i.e 11:30 to 12 noon. Any student found inside the hostel between the prohibited period without the prior permission of Principal or Warden will be strictly fined for Rs.100/-.
9. Maintain cleanliness of your room, bathroom and cubicles.
10. Cooking is not allowed in the rooms.
11. Nobody is allowed to roam in bathroom sleepers or night suits in the school campus/Mess.
12. Students should only sleep in the allotted room.
13. Indecent or rude behavior with the mess workers, Seniors/Juniors and other staff is strictly prohibited.
14. Mess timings are : Breakfast 7:00 – 8:00 am, Lunch 1:30 to 2:30 pm, Dinner 8-9 pm
15. No food should be wasted.
16. Proper clothes should be worn and hair be properly tied while coming to mess.
17. Clean uniform for clinical areas and community areas should be always available with the students.
18. In case of any emergency or health related problems, hostel Incharge should be informed.
19. Vehicles are not allowed in the hostel. Violation will invite fine from the authority.
20. Ragging is strictly prohibited in the campus.
21. No leave/outing will be given to pursue other academic courses during the course period.
22. Medical leave will granted only if prescribed by the SMO/MO of Govt. Institution.
23. No leave other than the Medical leave will be allowed.
24. If any student found absent from the hostel without any information, strict disciplinary action will be taken against him/her as proposed/recommend by the enquiry committee constituted by the competent authority.
25. In case of any indiscipline, the student will be expelled from the training after proper enquiry.
26. Students should strictly abide by the rules and regulations of the Institute, Hostel and Mess.
