Subject: Ban on manufacturing of plastic made Indian National Flags.

Sir/ Madam,

The use/display of the Indian National Flag is governed by the Flag Code of India, 2002 (available on the website of this Ministry www.mha.nic.in), which is a compendium of executive instructions, issued from time to time, covering various aspects of use/display of the National Flag. As per para 2.1 of the Flag Code, the National Flag shall be made of hand spun and hand woven wool or cotton or silk khadi bunting. As per sub-para (x) of the Para 2.2 of the Flag Code, the Flag made of paper may be waved by public on occasions of important national, cultural and sports events. However, such paper Flags should not be discarded or thrown on the ground after the event. As far as possible, it should be disposed of in private consistent with the dignity of the Flag. Large scale use of plastic made Indian National Flag by the common public including children has, however, been observed during these occasions. These plastic made Indian Flags are found discarded or thrown on the ground after the event. Since plastic Flags are not bio-degradable, these do not get destroyed for a long time. This also affects the dignity of the National Flag.

2. In this context and in compliance of the direction dated 29.09.2014 of the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay in the PIL No. 103/2011 titled Hindu Janjagruti Samiti Vs State of Maharashtra and others, the Ministry of Home Affairs vide its letter of even number dated 21.10.2014 sought views of all the State/Union Territory Governments over the banning of the manufacturing of the plastic made Indian National Flags. Almost all of the State/Union Territory Governments have supported the proposal. The Government of India agrees with the views of the States/Union Territories.

². All the State/Union Territory Governments are therefore, requested to take effective steps to ban/curb the manufacturing of Indian National Flags from plastic including its holding in stock or selling or distributing the plastic made Indian National Flags.
