Subject - Few important suggestions to curb corruption.

Sir

It is submitted that the senior officers in Chandigarh Secretariat, including your goodself, enjoy quasi judicial powers under various acts and hold the courts. It is brought to your notice that the lower staff dealing with the court cases indulge themselves in corruption and damage the good image/reputation of the honest officers. I would like to mention some instances where corruption prevails in the court cases.

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1. For fixing the dates of court cases
  2. For supplying of copies of orders
  3. For getting stay in court matters.
  4. For giving favour to parties while drafting the orders by concealing the facts.

I would also like to make the following important suggestions to curb corruption in court cases.

1. Date of hearing of case should be given by the officer himself - To stop corruption in fixing the favourable dates of hearing, it is suggested that the officer himself should give date of hearing of case. The power should be delegated to lower staff. It will help in curbing the corruption.
2. Uploading of cause list of court on website - The cause lists of the court cases should also be uploaded on website.
3. Uploading of orders (interim as well as final) passed on website - All the orders passed by the courts should be uploaded on website as is done in District Courts and High Court so that the citizens may download the same from anywhere and need not be approach the lower staff and bribe them. Even it is very sad to know that if the High Court and District Court where the number of cases being heard on daily basis is very high, the orders are uploaded on website and in the Chandigarh Secretariat where the number of cases is very lower and that too on weekly basis, the orders are not being uploaded on website just because to earn money by way of corruption.
4. Orders should be prepared by the officers themselves and should not drafted by the lower staff - It is also seen that in some cases, the lower staff of court after taking bribe favour the parties while drafting the orders of dismissed cases by concealing some important facts so that the parties could get relief from upper court. It is therefore suggested that instead of getting the orders drafted, the officers should prepare the orders themselves. The decisions should be pronounced in the open court. ✓
5. Stay should be awarded only in extreme circumstances - The corruption also prevails while getting the stay orders passed in favour of the parties. The parties after getting stay linger on the matter unnecessarily to gain benefit which causes loss to state exchequer. It is suggested that stay in matter be avoided and only be awarded in extreme circumstances. ✓

I hope that a due consideration will be given on the above suggestions and necessary steps will be taken to make Chandigarh corruption free.
