Shri V.P. Singh,

The International Human Rights Day is observed all over the world every year on 10th December to commemorate the adoption of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights by the United Nations General Assembly by organizing special functions.

- The National Human Rights Commission celebrates the Human Rights Day, on 10th December every year, by holding a special function in New Delhi.
- The Commission has adopted a Human Rights Pledge to be taken on Human Rights Day on 10th December every year (Copy enclosed).

- The National Human Rights Commission is of the view that administering the oath by the State Human Rights Commissions alone will have a limited impact. Human Rights Pledge is to be given its due significance particularly in the context of the observance of human rights by all concerned agencies which impact upon the daily life of citizens and accordingly, gives following suggestions for your consideration:

- Human Rights Pledge** may be administered to all the personnel of law enforcing agencies including State Police, Prison Staff, etc., which frequently come in conflict with the citizens on human rights issues during their normal course of operations/activities. This Pledge may be administered to all their rank and file at the stage of passing out from their training institutions, as well as on 10th December (Human Rights Day) each year in their respective offices.

- Taking into account the importance of human rights in the life of a citizen, it is imperative to introduce the Human Rights Pledge **not only** to law enforcing agencies as envisaged in (a) above, but also to consider introducing it to **all Government Servants and officers** on the pattern of other such pledges like Sadbhavana Pledge (20th August), Martyr Day Pledge (30th January) and Anti-terrorism Day (21st May).

- Human Rights as an issue needs to be appropriately put in the **school and college curriculum** so as to bring into focus its objectives and significance in the formative young years of the citizen. For this purpose, State Education Boards may also be directed to incorporate the Human Rights Pledge in a prominent section (front and back cover) of the **text books** of class 10 and 12.

- A column may also be incorporated in the Annual Confidential Report/ Annual Performance Appraisal Report (ACR/APAR) of all Group A & B state Government employees regarding description, approach and action taken on issues of Human Rights violations, if any, noticed/brought to the notice/handled by the officer in the course of his duties. This will go a long way in proper central positioning of Human Rights in the work sphere of officers. There is already a column in ACR/APAR forms dealing with SC/ST etc. and Human Rights actually are concerned with all the marginalized/disadvantaged sections of population (not just SC/ST) like women, children, bonded labour, LGBTI, minorities, undertrials and prisoners, etc.

- Taking into account the importance of Human Rights in the daily life of a citizen and the stress on "minimum government-maximum governance", I request you to kindly consider the above four suggestions, in Para 4 above, and issue necessary government orders at the highest level. We are addressing all State Governments in this regard and shall be grateful if you kindly send us a copy of the government orders issued by your State early to enable us to share with other States.

I _____ do solemnly swear that, I will follow, preserve, protect and defend "human rights", meaning the rights relating to life, liberty, equality and dignity of the individual guaranteed by the Constitution or embodied in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights adopted by the United Nations General Assembly on 10th December 1948, the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights and the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights adopted by the General Assembly of the United Nations on the 16th December, 1966 and such other Covenants or Conventions adopted by the General Assembly of the United Nations as the Central Government may, by notification, specify as enforceable by courts in India from time to time.

That, in the course of performance of my duties, I shall spread awareness of human rights.

That, I shall act against, and/or report, to the concerned authorities, any violation of human rights or abetment thereof or negligence in the prevention of such violation, by a public servant, that comes to my notice.
