Countdown to elections for 17th Lok Sabha has started early. The sense of purpose that is normally seen six months or so ahead of the elections is already in the air.

This then is the opportune time to present your achievements and outcomes for assessment, based on credible and independent third party research. We have started the Governance evaluations for SKOCH State of Governance Report Card 2018 that is scheduled for release in June 2018. The Report Card would be in time for you to be able to use it as an effective evidence-based communication on the State of Governance to your electorate.

For the period 2009-2014 your Union Territory missed the evaluation hence was not ranked. This has become number 16 for period April 2014 to March 2017. This now is the last evaluation that would take into account the period April 2017 to March 2018. As of now your national ranking from April 2017 to December 2017 is number 19. This then makes a compelling case for the Union Territory to participate.

From the enclosed Nomination Form you would notice that several states have been able to take giant leaps in performance even in one year depending on the number of good projects that they were able to submit for evaluation and to compete for the Award. A list of year-wise awards won by your State is enclosed for your kind reference.

would urge your State to participate and Nominate a large number of projects that can be evaluated and benchmarked nationally for the SKOCH Governance Award 2018. This may require a direction from your side as well as you nominating a senior nodal officer to coordinate this effort in the State. The last date is 30th April 2018 to enable us to evaluate and release the report by June 2018.

his evaluation would serve for deciding on SKOCH Governance Award 2018 that results in the ranking of the states. The award would be conferred on 23rd June 2018 at Constitution Club, Rafi Marg, New Delhi as a part of 52nd SKOCH Summit and National Exhibition on the 'State of Governance.'

From our side a team led by Mr Deepak Dalal is coordinating this nation-building exercise. He is available at deepak@skoch.in or 0124-4777444. We shall also depute a senior researcher from our side to coordinate with the Nodal officer thus nominated for the purpose.

Each project is evaluated by our Jury comprising of very senior government officials and domain experts.

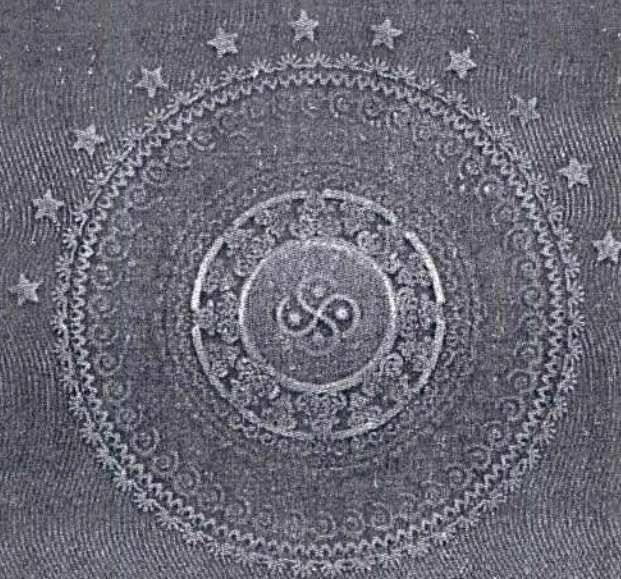

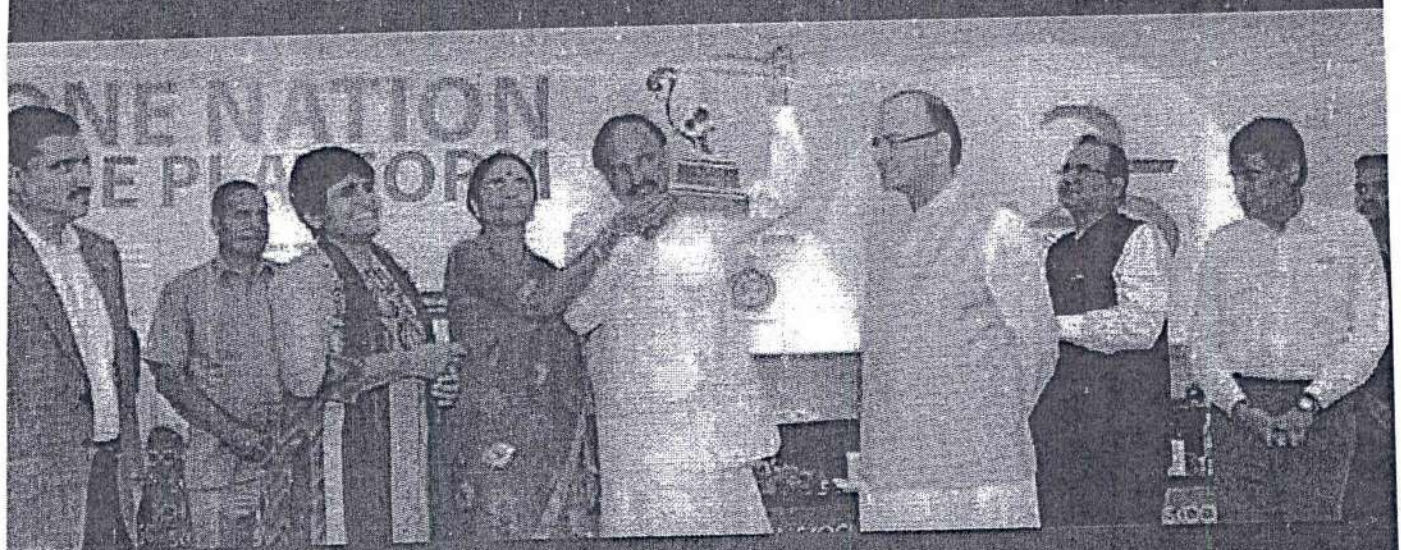

SKOCH AWARD

These are competitive awards, based on extensive documentation based nomination. These then go through a whetting process based on desk and secondary research followed by an evaluation presentation to an eminent Jury.

Top performers are identified based on the average score awarded by Jurors and Expert Vote and participation in National Exhibit (optional). Good performance at the Expert Vote adds a weightage to the Jury score. Expert Vote from across India becomes an important benchmark for Nominees' evaluation and ranking for the SKOCH Award. Chief Ministers and political leadership are selected based on the cumulative ranking achieved by the state. Only the best performers nationally are conferred the SKOCH Award. Typically, 30 awards are conferred.

SKOCH ORDER-OF-MERIT AWARD

These are competitive awards that recognise all meritorious Nominees from across the country in a particular category. Nominees submit their documentation in a prescribed Nomination format, which goes through a whetting process based on desk and secondary research followed by the an Evaluation Presentation to the Jury of domain experts.

Post the Evaluation Presentation, all the Nominees are invited to participate in a Popular Vote online with the objective of seeking satisfactory performance inputs from their beneficiaries and other stakeholders. This is an online process and involves use of *Twitter*.

SKOCH Order-of-Merit is decided based on the average Jury score + Popular Vote weightage.

This is not a mandatory option, however, without the Popular Vote weightage, Nominees compete only on their average Jury score. In the past, there have been instances of Nominees winning if their average Jury score itself is high enough.

All top performers are conferred the SKOCH Order-of-Merit Award. Typically, 150 Nominations are conferred the SKOCH Order-of-Merit.

SKOCH AWARD 2018 METHODOLOGY IS AS FOLLOWS:

1. There is no Fee for applying for the SKOCH Award.
2. Selected Nominations will be called for Evaluation Presentation to the Panel of Expert Jury at New Delhi at their cost.
3. For each Nomination selected, only one person is allowed to be present / participate in the Evaluation Presentation. It is recommended that the best person for the job is nominated.
4. In case, more people wish to accompany the Presenter—limited to two persons only—a Participation Fee of INR 2,000/- (plus GST) per person, will be applicable.

METHODOLOGY FOR SKOCH ORDER-OF-MERIT

1. Based on the presentation an independent Jury of domain experts will rank the Nominees.
2. Highest-ranking Nominees will be shortlisted and invited to seek Popular Vote from their beneficiaries and stakeholders. This voting is online and involves use of Twitter. Participation in Popular Vote is recommended.
