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'Stree Swabhiman' project by Common Services Centres

- In absence of an emphasis on a linkage between menstruation and women's health, the stigmatization continues to risk health of adolescent girls and women. This affects their day-to-day functioning and participation in public life.
- Common Services Centers (CSCs), through its initiative started on 2 November 2017 for women's health and hygiene, named 'Stree Swabhiman', is striving to create a sustainable model for providing affordable and accessible sanitary products to adolescent girls and women, especially in rural areas.
- Under this project, Micro Sanitary Napkin Manufacturing Units are being set up at CSCs across the country, particularly those operated by women VLEs. The sanitary napkins produced by these units not only suit the needs of low-income communities, but are also bio-degradable and thus environment friendly. Besides, these are made easily accessible to rural communities.
- The initiative is driven by personalized outreach and awareness of village level women entrepreneurs who produce and market sanitary napkins. Women have played a crucial role as change agents under the Digital India Programme. As many as 46,597 women are working as Village Level Entrepreneurs (VLEs) through the CSCs across the country.
- Apart from boosting women's health and hygiene, this initiative will also provide employment opportunities to women in rural communities as each facility will employ 5-8 women.

Role of CSCs-

CSCs provide, install and test the machines and train their Village Level
 Entrepreneurs and his/her team members.

The Manufacturing units are easy to set up and maintain, produce 1100-1500 units of 260mm sterilized ultra-sanitary napkins a day, use less electricity, require less than 600 sq. ft. to set up and generates employment for 5-8 women per unit.

Financing-

- CSC helps the VLEs secure small loans from public sector banks to meet the initial set-up costs.
- In order to bring about a behavior change and promote use of sanitary napkins in rural areas, CSC follows an incentive based model for villages. Under this, the VLE will distribute sanitary napkins free of cost among adolescent girls in village schools. Girls can also avail the same from their nearest CSC.
- CSC will explore corporate CSR funds/donor agencies to support an incentive of Rs. 500 per girl to the VLE for a year. It is expected that after one year, the women/girls would start purchasing the same from the local VLE, thus making the unit self-sustainable. Donors can make the donation through online portal: www.streeswabhiman.in and can generate the receipt online for the same.
- Distribution of sanitary napkins in schools also takes care of the issue of lack of market access to sanitary napkins in rural areas. It also takes care of cultural inhibitions among rural women of buying sanitary napkins from stores operated by men.
