Dear Colleague,

As you are aware Directorate General of Employment & Training (DGE&T), under Ministry of Labour and Employment runs the Craftsmen Training Scheme (CTS) and the Apprenticeship Training Scheme (ATS). The CTS is implemented through a network of Government & Private Industrial Training Institutes, wherein skill training is imparted to eligible candidates in 127 trades. After completion of this training, candidates appear in the All India Trade Test (AITT) and the successful candidates are awarded National Trade Certificate (NTC), issued by the National Council for Vocational Training (NCVT).

In ATS, a candidate can undergo on-the-job training after successful completion of CTS or directly after completion of prescribed education level. The NTC holders are provided a training credit in form of rebate in their training period under ATS. The training under ATS is provided in both Public & Private Sector establishments. After completion of their training, candidates appear in the AITT and successful candidates are awarded National Apprenticeship Certificate (NAC), which has a higher weightage than the NTC.

It has been brought to the notice of DGE&T that many Government Ministries/Organizations/PSUs for some posts have minimum entry qualification as 'NTC' or ITI Pass-out and candidates who have got NAC after successful completion of ATS are sometimes not considered eligible to apply for such posts, despite having higher qualification.

It is accordingly requested that all the organizations under your administrative control be requested to ensure that this problem is attended to and if required Recruitment Rules be amended so that candidates having higher qualification are not deprived of opportunities on this count.
