

Subject: Meeting to review the implementation of flagship schemes in the Union Territories-regarding.

A meeting, to review the status of implementation of various flagship schemes in UTs, was held at 03:00 P.M on 13<sup>th</sup> November, 2019 under the chairmanship of Cabinet Secretary at Committee room, Cabinet Secretariat, Rashtrapati Bhavan, New Delhi.

2. The Committee was informed that for Direct Benefit Transfer, the status of Aadhaar seeding of beneficiaries and transfer of funds through electronic mode, was better than the national average. It was observed that action for data reconciliation and 100% progress in respect of Puducherry and Andaman & Nicobar Islands, needed to be undertaken immediately. While the achievement of 100% progress in all parameters was noted for all but one UT in the **Swachh Bharat (Gramin) Mission**, Puducherry was advised to complete 100% Geo-tagging of Individual House Hold Latrines (IHHLs) at the earliest. For **Swachh Bharat (Urban) Mission**, the Committee noted with concern the lack of progress in achieving targets for Individual House Hold Latrines and Solid Waste Management in respect of UTs of Delhi and Puducherry. The need for achieving 100% target by all stakeholders was stressed. Self-sufficiency of funds, in all Municipal Corporations of Delhi, was emphasized. On the aspect of reducing use of **Single Plastic**, it was noted that based on the advisory of MoEF&CC to reduce use of such products, all UTs except Daman & Diu, Daman & Nagar Haveli and Delhi, have issued necessary notifications. It was also suggested that details of **Households with piped water supply** in UTs and incremental progress on this parameter may also be monitored.

3. Under the **Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA)**, it was noted that while input indicators like Gross Enrolment Ratio are healthy in case of all UTs save Lakshadweep, concerted action was required in respect of output indicators like performance in Mathematics and Languages. It was suggested that UTs may encourage use of online tutorials available on the digital portal called DIKSHA. The Committee was apprised that while health indicators in all the UT under the **National Health Mission (NHM)**, were better than the national average, there was a need to further improve the same. Issue of data discrepancy was also required to be sorted out. While satisfactory performance in **Pradhan Mantri Jan-Arogya Yojana (PM-JAY)**, was reported in all UTs save Lakshadweep, issue of clarifications on portability across empaneled hospitals in neighbouring areas, was considered necessary. Convergence of existing schemes of UTs, utilization of all hospitals in the Government sector, and issue of health cards to all beneficiaries was stressed. Under **Poshan Abhiyaan**, emphasis on monitorable parameters was stressed. It was noted that capacity building modules for Anganwadi workers had been completed only in a few UTs. It was informed that the **Pradhan Mantri MatruVandana Yojana (PM-MVY)** had stabilized in all UTs except Delhi. Comparison of performance of UTs at the national level, was advised.

4. It was noted that there has been considerable progress in **Providing Broadband Connectivity** in UTs, with enhancement in available bandwidths and major work underway on the Submarine OFC Connectivity project. Under the **Government E-marketplace (GeM)** purchases, the need to capture the progress in UTs with respect to the potential for purchase, was emphasized. Underperformance of most UTs in achieving their **Renewable Energy** targets was noted. The need to prescribe targets in real terms and benchmark with performance of States, was considered necessary.

5. It was noted that except Delhi and Chandigarh, all other UTs are lagging in **Smart Cities Mission** projects. With regard to implementation of **Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Urban)**, it was noted that barring Daman & Diu and Dadra & Nagar Haveli, the progress of all other UTs has been poor, primarily on account of non-availability of land. A review of **Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Gramin)** brought out the existence of data mismatch, due to which actual progress was not being reflected. On the issue of **Business Reform Action Plan (BRAP)** for improving business environment, given the lack of progress in UTs, the need for a time bound action plan to carry out required reforms, with appropriate hand holding by D/f PIIT, MHA and relevant Departments/Ministries, was emphasized.

6. Review of the status of GST implementation in UTs, brought out the imperative of comparing the data trend in UTs with the overall national average/trend, alongwith an analysis for the same. Timely filing of returns and following up on defaulting taxpayers was emphasized. With reference to the newly created UTs of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, it was advised that their performance be depicted on the lines of other UTs.



7. After detailed deliberations, the following recommendations were made:

- (i) UTs need to be role models in implementation of flagship programmes and must achieve 100% progress in these programmes.
- (ii) Discrepancies in data in respect of various indicators, as reported by UTs and as maintained by relevant Ministries/Departments, be reconciled forthwith;
- (iii) The presentation be restructured to reflect broad indicators, major trends alongwith analysis. Benchmarking with national averages be done and UTs be ranked accordingly. Data in respect of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh be incorporated;
- (iv) Geo-tagging of IHHLs in Puducherry and second verification of ODF Panchayats in Lakshadweep be completed within a month. Govt of Delhi and Puducherry to achieve targets for Individual House Hold Latrines and ramp up efforts on Solid Waste Management, in coordination with M/o EF&CC, at the earliest;
- (v) Action plan for monitoring the progress of Household Piped Water Supply, ("Nal se Jal" Scheme) be prepared and included for discussion;
- (vi) Presentation of data with regard to SSA, NHM, PM-JAY, Poshan Abhiyan and PM-MVY, be made using clear input and output indicators. UTs to make concerted efforts to consistently improve on these parameters. Under PM-JAY, utilization of all hospitals in Government Sector and issue of cards to all beneficiaries be ensured;
- (vii) The work of enhancing Satellite band width in Lakshadweep be completed at the earliest. Analysis be carried out of the existing potential for use of GeM and the actual usage by the UTs. Renewable Energy policy be modified to accommodate the requirements of UTs.
- (viii) MoHUA to expedite finalization of guidelines for making Govt/CPSE land available for Affordable Housing Projects. DPIIT to handhold UTs to improve their business environment;
- (ix) UTs to focus on timely filing of GST returns and following up on defaulting taxpayers.

The meeting ended with a vote of Thanks to the Chair.

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
