Inherited Vascular Bleeding Disorders

1. Hereditary haemorrhagic telangiectasia (Osler-Weber-Rendu disease)
2. Inherited disorders of connective tissue matrix

Acquired Vascular Bleeding Disorders

1. Henoch-Schönlein purpura
2. Haemolytic-uraemic syndrome
3. Simple easy bruising (Devil's pinches)
4. Infection
5. Drug reactions
6. Steroid purpura
7. Senile purpura
8. Scurvy

HAEMORRHAGIC DIATHESSES DUE TO PLATELET DISORDERS

- A. *Due to reduction in the number of platelets* i.e. various forms of thrombocytopenias.
- B. *Due to rise in platelet count* i.e. thrombocytosis.
- C. *Due to defective platelet functions.*

THROMBOCYTOPENIAS

1. Impaired platelet production.
2. Accelerated platelet destruction.
3. Splenic sequestration.
4. Dilutional loss.
