Inherited Vascular Bleeding Disorders

- 1. Hereditary haemorrhagic telangiectasia (Osler-Weber-Rendu disease)
- 2. Inherited disorders of connective tissue matrix

Acquired Vascular Bleeding Disorders

- 1. Henoch-Schönlein purpura
- 2. Haemolytic-uraemic syndrome
- 3. Simple easy bruising (Devil's pinches)
- 4. Infection
- 5. Drug reactions
- 6. Steroid purpura
- 7. Senile purpura
- 8. Scurvy

HAEMORRHAGIC DIATHESES DUE TO PLATELET DISORDERS

- A. Due to reduction in the number of platelets i.e. various forms of thrombocytopenias.
- B. Due to rise in platelet count i.e. thrombocytosis.
- C. Due to defective platelet functions.

THROMBOCYTOPENIAS

- 1. Impaired platelet production.
- 2. Accelerated platelet destruction.
- 3. Splenic sequestration.
- 4. Dilutional loss.
